- ³ Although the vote pattern appears contradictory compared to the other votes on this issue, it is not. This vote is not on the Singpoli Project itself but on a Request for Proposal (RFP) process.
 - **Tony Wu** wanted to simply enter into a contract with Singpoli to sell the land without a competitive RFP process.
 - **Lloyd Johnson** saw the RFP process as a way of exploring what other proposals the city might receive in addition to Singpoli's.
