The California Political Reform Act (Government Code § 81000) requires specific campaign disclosure statements showing detailed accounting information on contributions received or money spent in support of a candidate, campaign, or measure to be filed at specific points in time. This chart summarizes itemized campaign contributions the candidates reported on their Preelection Statement.² Unless noted otherwise, this chart does not include contributions by business or recipient committees or loans received.

- Notes:** 1 Data Sources: The September 20, 2020 - October 17, 2020 reporting period is the first reporting period recognized for this election for all candidates. Candidates who previously established a committee will most likely have funds from the previous reporting period(s). Reports are posted on the city website at "Campaign Disclosure Reports & Public Official Appointments". Districts were identified using unredacted reports obtained via a Public Records Request and the city website page "Find Your Council District."
- 2 FPPC regulations and West Covina Municipal Code § 2-401 requires full disclosure of campaign donations of \$100 or more (itemized). Donations of less than \$100 may be totaled and reported as one amount received during a designated reporting period (unitemized). Donations of less than \$100 are not included in this chart.
- 3 West Covina Municipal Code § 2-402 limits campaign contributions to a maximum dollar amount per election per calendar year. The limit is automatically adjusted on January 1 of odd numbered years according to the Consumer Price Index established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Los Angeles, Riverside, and Orange County areas. The City of West Covina website states the current contribution limit is \$530.99.
- 4 West Covina Municipal Code § 2-405.1 prohibits applicants or contractors from making any contributions to individuals already elected to office.
- 5 Election to office does not stop reporting requirements. Reporting requirements stop when the committee is terminated.
- 6 Gutierrez reported no contributions received. On Schedule B, Loans Received he reports loaning his campaign \$1,050 during this reporting period.
- 7 The candidate report submission deadline for this reporting period was Thursday, October 22, 2020. The City Clerk's Office "Date Stamp" shows the report was received on Tuesday, October 27, 2020.
- 8 Shewmaker reports no contributions or loans received. On Schedule F, Accrued Expenses (Unpaid Bills) one item is listed: \$3,511.44 for literature owed to John Shewmaker.
